History of DuPage Township from the Supervisor

Fellow Residents,

Township government is the oldest continuous form of government in the United States. It can trace its origins back to 1636.

The Illinois Constitution of 1848 allowed counties to choose to establish townships within their boundaries. Today, 85 of the 102 Illinois counties operate under the township form of government. DuPage Township takes its name from the DuPage River. The name "DuPage" is an Anglican corruption of the name of an early French settler named "DuPazhe". Long before Romeoville (1960) and Bolingbrook (1965) were incorporated, the residents of the area lived near the DuPage River in the "Town of DuPage". Thus the logic of naming the township "DuPage". The township was formally established on April 2, 1850.

Some statistics for DuPage Township. The township encompasses 36.77 sq miles. It stretches from the DuPage County border in the North (87th Street) to 135th Street to the South. The eastern border is approximately I-355 with the western border Kings Rd. Its 2020 population is approximately 89,000. That makes it the largest township in Will County population wise, followed closely by Joliet Township. The three major municipalities in the township are Bolingbrook, Romeoville and Naperville.

Food Pantries Have a Long History of Service to the Township

DuPage Township residents who need supplemental food items can find resources at food pantries in the township. DuPage Township has maintained a food pantry in Romeoville for many years, and several volunteer organizations in the township also maintain food pantries as well. If you are aware of a person or family in need, please let them know that these resources are available.

DuPage Township Food Pantry

The DuPage Township Food Pantry was established by the Township Board of Trustees to supplement the needs of the Township's residents. In recent years, the Food Pantry has grown from serving approximately 60 families a month to now serving over 1000 families a month.

The Food Pantry is available to DuPage Township families who are experiencing a food crisis. Residents may come to the pantry three times a month and receive a supplement for planning meals for their families. Food Pantry distribution center: 719 Parkwood Avenue, Romeoville, Illinois

Please note: Upon acceptance of USDA food commodities, you are required to certify with your signature that your gross income does not exceed Illinois Department of Human Services established income limits and that you live within the boundaries of DuPage Township. Willful diversion of commodities for person gain is a federal offense. You can be prosecuted for giving false information to the Food Pantry.

September was Hunger Action Month and as such DuPage Township Food Pantry has expanded their weekly hours to now include Saturdays. As promised by Supervisor Marschke and the Board of Trustees, the pantry will be open each Saturday

from 9:00 AM until 11:00 AM for all those qualifying Township residents. As always, please bring current proof of Township residency and a picture ID.

This year the Township will be providing Holiday Turkey Breasts and Meal kits to EVERY unit at Romeoville Gardens, McKenzie Falls, and Greenleaf. These meals will be delivered on Tuesday, November 23rd after 9:00 AM. Since each unit will be receiving a complete meal kit, there is no need to register as has been done in the past. A reminder brochure will be provided to your management company to distribute to your unit closer to the delivery date.

Finally, our annual Thanksgiving Meal distribution date has been set. This year the event will be held on Saturday, November 20th starting at 9:00 AM. As in the past, a ticket to the event is required for each qualifying household. Tickets can be obtained at the Food Pantry, during pantry distribution hours on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, starting September 21st. Holiday Meal kits include not only the Turkey and a full compliment of sides, but white and sweet potatoes, a pie, produce, bread, etc.





SUPERVISOR'S CORNER

Vicente Fernandez, *General Assistance Director*

Meet the newest staff member to join our team, Vicente Fernandez, our General Assistance Director. Prior to his time with DuPage Township, Vincente was a case manager at the Will County Center for Community Concerns in Joliet and prior to that was a case manager for the supportive housing and interim housing programs through DuPage Pads in Wheaton. Vicente graduated from Northern Illinois University in 2007 with a degree in History and minor in Philosophy and graduated in 2009 with a degree in Philosophy from Conception Seminary College in Conception, MO. Vicente speaks four languages, is an avid Cubs fan, likes Star Wars, Batman and has been a resident of Bolingbrook for the last seven years where he lives with his wife and two children. General Assistance, what is it?

In the 1848 Illinois State Constitution, it outlined that local residents can set up “townships” to achieve three main goals: to assess properties, maintain roads and to provide general assistance to the “indigent.” For those who do not know, “indigent” is another way of saying “poor” or “needy.” While the state has had other constitutions since then, the main goals of the township remain. Nowadays, General Assistance is set up as a program as a “last resort” for those who are ineligible for other mainline assistance such as those programs administered through the Department of Human Services (DHS) like SNAP, Medicaid or TANF. Residents receiving general assistance can receive assistance with payment towards rent, utilities, food and *under certain circumstances*, funeral and burial expenses up to \$1,500.

The General Assistance Office also administers “Emergency Assistance” for those facing life threatening circumstances when it comes to their housing or utilities. Both General Assistance and Emergency Assistance are the primary ways that the township helps residents. In addition, the township also serves as an extension to the local Salvation Army through several of their programs as well. Also, if the general assistance office is unable to assist, we will find additional resources for help.

To qualify, one must be a resident of the township, be 18 years or older and meet financial qualifications. For emergency assistance, a resident **must** be delinquent or behind on their rent or utility bills, either facing eviction or utility shut-off. A resident can apply for emergency assistance only once every twelve months. To learn more or apply, contact the General Assistance Office at 630-759-1317 ext. 203 or email at ga@dupagetownship.com

¿Que es, Ayuda General?

En la constitución del estado de Illinois de 1848, indicó que los residentes locales pueden establecer “townships” (un forma y nivel de gobierno) para lograr tres metas, valorar propiedades, mantener carreteras y proveer ayuda general a los que son “indigente.” Para los que no saben, “indigente” es decir “pobre” o “necesitado.” El estado ha tenido otras constituciones, pero las metas han quedado. Hoy, la ayuda general (General Assistance) es un programa de “ultima recurso” pro aquellas personas que no son eligible por ayuda del estado como los programas administrados por medio del Departamento de Servicios Humano (DHS) como SNAP, Medicaid (tarjeta medica) o TANF (ayuda de efectivo). La ayuda general ayuda con pagos para renta, utilidades, comida y *bajo ciertas circunstancias*, gastos de funeral y entierro hasta \$1,500.

También, la oficina de ayuda general administra el programa de ayuda de emergencia (Emergency Assistance) por aquellas personas experimentando circunstancias de peligro de vida con su habitación o utilidades. Los programas de ayuda y ayuda de emergencia son las maneras primarias que el “township” ayuda los residentes. Además, el “township” sirve como una extensión local del Salvation Army y las programas que ellos ofrecen. Si la oficina de ayuda general no puede ayudarle, podemos darle información a otros recursos.

Para calificar, uno tiene que ser un residente del área local, ser mayor de 18 años y ser calificado financial. Para la ayuda de emergencia, el residente **tiene** que estar atrasado con la renta o fracturas de utilidades. Un residente puede recibir ayuda una vez cada 12 meses. 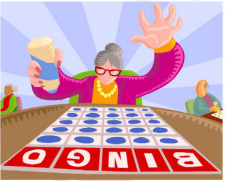

In 2021 our information shows that home sales prices are continuing to go up. That is good news for homeowners!

If you have a new exemption to sign up for or if you are just turning 65, we can help you fill out those exemption forms. The household income level is \$65,000

for the Senior Freeze Exemption. If you are not sure if you qualify, bring all your income tax papers to our office and we can look at that for you. Our office is open to the public, Monday – Friday 9:00 am – 4:00 pm. Another service we provide in the Assessor's office is Free Notary. So if you ever need something notarized, please stop by our office!

DuPage Township residents can take advantage of local public transportation services to access neighboring communities, regional attractions, and popular local destinations. Pace Suburban Bus has four nearby routes providing convenient connections to downtown Chicago, other Pace service and Metra train lines. The Pace bus routes in DuPage Township are:

Route 834 - Joliet-Downers Grove

Provides service from Joliet central business district and Metra Station to Finley & Branding. Serves Lewis University, Good Samaritan Hospital, Romeoville, Lockport, Bolingbrook, Will County Courthouse, Yorktown Shopping Center and Downers Grove. Certain trips connect with Metra-BNSF service in Downers Grove. [Posted stop info](#)

850 - North Bolingbrook – East Loop Express

Provides weekday rush hour service between the Pace Canterbury Park-n-Ride in Bolingbrook and portions of the Loop, Streeterville and River North in Chicago. [Posted stop info](#)

851 - South Bolingbrook – East Loop Express

Provides weekday rush hour service between the Pace Park-n-Ride at White Fence Farm in Romeoville and portions of the Loop, Streeterville and River North in Chicago. [Posted stop info](#)

Route 755 - Plainfield - IMD - West Loop Express

Provides bi-directional, weekday rush hour service between the Plainfield Park-n-Ride, the Illinois Medical District, and Union Station in the West Loop, with intermediate stops along I-55 at the Pace Park-n-Ride in Bolingbrook, the CTA Pink Line Damen Station and UIC. Route serves Posted Stops Only along the entire route.

Posted stop info

Passengers may board and exit the bus at specific locations at Pace bus stop signs, the locations of which are found at the “posted stops info” on our website. The one-way fare for the I-55 express services to Chicago is \$4.50 or \$2.50 with a reduced fare card. The regular bus route fare is \$2.00 with a Ventra Card or \$2.25 with cash. DuPage Township Dial-a-Ride service is available for seniors and disabled residents who have an RTA reduced fare card.

Eligible residents can travel from their home to locations within the township or to connect with other Pace service. Operating Monday – Friday, 7:00am – 5:00pm, the service costs \$1.00 each way and reservations are taken up to seven days in advance. ILLINOIS HOME WEATHERIZATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Illinois Home Weatherization Assistance Program is designed to help income-eligible Will County residents save fuel and energy while increasing the comfort of their homes. Assistance is available to both homeowners and renters, and can be applied to single-family residents, multi-unit buildings, mobile homes, and townhouses and condos (within association guidelines).



An assessor will conduct an energy audit on approved residences to determine what measures will make the home more comfortable and energy-efficient. Once the assessment is complete, a contractor will be assigned to apply the appropriate measures.

The program evaluates:

- Heating system: furnace will be tested and repaired or replaced if necessary
- Insulation of exterior walls and attic areas
- Weather-stripping of doors, or replacement if needed
- Caulking of windows; repair or replace if needed
- Sealing of other bypasses that allow heated or cooled air to escape from the home
- Other energy conservation measures as funding allows, such as replacement of old refrigerators with new energy efficient models
- Material and labor are free of charge to qualified homeowners. In order to provide services to leased homes or apartments, the landlord must agree to authorize work on the property and are responsible for 50% of mechanical costs when applicable.

Applications are taken on a first come / first served basis Monday through Friday from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm at our Joliet office. Please refer to our outreach

calendar for information on locations and dates if you live in outlying areas of the county.

Please bring the following information when applying:

- Social Security cards for all household members
- Gross income for 90 days prior to date of application for every household member 18 years of age or older
- Most recent gas and electric bills
- Proof of ownership (deed, tax bill, mortgage statement or title, copy of current lease if renting)
- Landlords will be contacted to provide a copy of property deed as proof of ownership
- Other documents may be requested at time of application

The Will County Center for Community Concerns (WCCCC) administers the Home Energy Assistance Program that helps income-eligible households with their utility bills and furnace assistance. Assistance is available to households whose 30 day gross income is at or below 200% of the poverty level. Assistance for utilities will be available from **September 1, 2021 through May 31, 2022, or until funds have been exhausted, whichever comes first.**

WCCCC will accept applications for all income eligible households beginning September 1, 2021 through May 31, 2022, or until all funds have been exhausted.

To submit an application, you MUST bring ALL required documentation:

1. Social Security Card for everyone in the household
2. ID or Drivers License
3. Income for all household members for the last 30 days
4. Any Household member age 18 or older will need proof they are or are not receiving benefits from DHS (Public Aid) and IDES (Unemployment) if there is no proof of income provided
5. Gas and Electric bill issued within last 30 days
6. All printouts from other agencies, like Food stamps, Medical Card, Social Security, TANF, General Assistance, Veterans Assistance
7. Mortgage statement and tax bill or Deed and tax bill, if applying for Furnace assistance.
8. Other documents may be needed based on your household situation

Applications will be taken at the DuPage Township Office every Monday from 9am to 2pm (excluding holidays) or until the daily sign-in sheet is full (whichever comes first). In addition, applications will be taken at various locations throughout the Will County area. 6. Prueba de asistencia de otras agencias (SNAP- Asistencia Para Nutrición Suplementaria , Asistencia Médica, TANF- Asistencia Económica)
