FOOD FOR THOUGHT: DuPage Township Food Pantry

Our Food Pantry is a shining example of our Township's service to the needs of our community. During the past year, the pantry served almost 8300 households. That equates to approximately **25,000 individuals**. We gave out Thanksgiving dinners to 430 families, delivered 442 dinners to the Senior Living locations in Bolingbrook and Romeoville, totaling some 2022 individuals. We also donated to the Lions' club turkey meal giveaway at the Township offices. Our assistance allowed the Lion's club to distribute another 100 holiday meals.

In addition, we have periodic food drops at the senior apartment complexes, deliver food to families without transportation and help families in the Will County immigration program. During the school year, we had backpacks of food delivered to four schools.

To accomplish this, each week, we picked up donations at 37 scheduled stores, with additional pickups at the Northern Illinois Food Bank, which sells the Food Pantry food at an extremely low cost.

The combination of donations and purchases resulted in the Food Pantry handling over **2,000,000 pounds** of product for distribution to our Township's needy families

Our Food Pantry clients must meet US Dept. of Agriculture income requirements to use the Food Pantry. According to these standards, 20% of the families in the Township qualify for food assistance at the pantry.

Regarding whom uses the pantry now, approximately 75% of the Food Pantry clients are residents of Bolingbrook, 20% are from Romeoville, and 5% are from other parts of the Township. We can and need to do more. The Food Pantry is in an industrial park at the southern end of the Township. It is the vacated Township Highway Department garage. It has been the Food Pantry since our Township Highway Dept was eliminated. It is not conveniently located, is difficult to find, and truck traffic makes parking precarious.

We plan to build a Food Pantry centrally located in the Township and move the Food Pantry to that location. We have been working with the county, state, and federal governments for grants to finance the new Food Pantry. 

OTHER PROGRAMS TO **HELP TOWNSHIP** RESIDENTS







SALVATION ARMY SERVICE EXTENSION

The Salvation Army Extension is the way that they are able to help as many people as possible in the area. While there is no Salvation Army Center in the immediate area, the Salvation Army is able to have a presence through its partnership with local agencies and organizations. The Salvation Army Extension helps those in need with delinquent rent or utility assistance. Assistance can only be given once in a 12 month period.

NICOR SHARING

Nicor Sharing is a one time grant to those who meet the income qualifications (201%-300% of the Federal poverty level) and have experienced a financial crisis such as a drop in income or unexpected expense. The benefit can help with past due balances. Account must be active or grant amount is enough to reinstate service if account is inactive. Veterans who have already applied for LIHEAP can also apply for this program.

HELP TO OTHERS (H2O)

H2O Help to Others is a customer assistance program created by Illinois American Water and Illinois' Salvation Army agencies. The program helps provide supplemental funding to Illinois American Water residential customers who would otherwise have trouble paying their bills. H2O Help to Others is supported by contributions from Illinois American Water and contributions from customers. Residents can apply for a one time grant that can only be utilized in a 12 month period.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program

Need help with your home energy bills? LIHEAP applications are still being taken at the township every Monday from 9am-3pm on a walk in basis only. Documents needed to apply, but not limited to:

- Photo ID
- Gas and electric bill
- Social Security Cards of everyone in the household
- Proof of all household income for last 30 days
- If there is no income of any adult household member 18 or older will need proof that they are or are not receiving benefits from DHS (Public Aid) and IDES (Unemployment)

GENERAL AND EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

General Assistance is a state mandated program for those individuals who have absolutely no income and little assets. General Assistance is an ongoing 12 month program and is considered a program of "last resort." Recipients receive a benefit to help with basic necessities, utilities and housing. Contact the General Assistance office to see if you qualify.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

Emergency Assistance is a program to help residents in "life threatening" circumstances such as rental eviction or utility shut-off. Also, residents can receive work related assistance with regards to car repair. Assistance is only given once in a 12 month period. Applicants must meet financial and nonfinancial qualifications.



ASISTENCIA GENERAL

Asistencia General is un programa mandado por el estado de Illinois por aquellas pesonsas con absolutamente ningún ingresso. Asistencia General es un programa por un máximo de 12 meses y es considerado un programa de "ultimo recurso." Residentes recibe un beneficio para ayudar con necesidades básicas, utilidades y renta. Llame a la oficina de Asistencia General para mas informatción.

ASISTENCIA DE EMERGENCIA

Asistencia de Emergencia es un programa por personas en circunstancias de "peligro de vida" como evicción o perdido de servicios publicos. Además, residentes pueden recibir asistencia relacionada con el trabajo como arreglamiento del automovil. Asistencia es disponible una vez, cada 12 meses. Residentes tienen que calificar financialmente y no financiero.

HINES VA HOSPITAL OUTREACH

The Hines VA Hospital will have an outreach person here at the township in January, February and March. The purpose of the outreach is for veterans to enroll in services and to have some minor health screenings. This outreach opportunity is not only for veterans in the township but also the surrounding area, so spread the word to any veterans who may wish to take advantage of this opportunity.

RECORDING YOUR DD214

As a service to veterans in Will County, the Will County Recorder can record a copy of a veteran's DD214. To have your DD214 recorded, the veteran must bring a picture ID along with the DD214 to be recorded. Recording the DD214 along with regular copies and certified copies are free of charge.

Public Act 093-0468 protects the rights of veterans and a DD214 is no longer considered public record. Only the service person is allowed to obtain a copy of the recorded DD214. Spouses and family members would need to contact the Veterans Assistance Commission for the same information. The Will County Recorder is available at the DuPage Township office every Tuesday and Thursday, 8:30am-4:30pm. For more information call: 815-740-4637







OTHER TOWNSHIP SERVICES

Couples wishing to marry or join into a civil union in Will County can apply for a marriage *license* or civil union *license* at the township. If either applicant had been previously married, they would need to present a copy of their divorce decree from their previous marriage. Please note too that DuPage Township does not conduct ceremonies and this service is for a marriage license <u>not</u> marriage certificate. For more information go to:

Another service through the township is for first time applicants for a passport can submit their passport application at the township. DuPage Township can only do **first time** passport applications, **not renewals**. The township also does not take passport pictures and must be done ahead of time.

Both of these services are done by **appointment only**. Please contact the township at 630-759-1317 to make an appointment and for information about requirements and fees for these services.

ILLINOIS BENEFIT ACCESS PROGRAM

Seniors and those who are disabled may qualify for a discount on their IL vehicle sticker or obtain a free transit card. Those who are interested in applying must meet residency and income requirements and can stop by the township office to apply
