3 MILLION DOLLARS For DuPage Township Food Pantry

In the Omnibus bill passed by Congress in December 2022, Congressman Bill Foster (D-11) included an earmark grant for the construction of a new Food Pantry and resource center for DuPage Township. The grant is for THREE MILLION DOLLARS.

The current food pantry is located in the old DuPage Township public works garage located in an industrial park in Romeoville. It is hard to get to, energy inefficient, run down and in need of maintenance. It was designed and built to be a garage and is not American Disability Act (ADA) compliant.

The new facility will be located at the corner of Canterbury Lane and Lily Cache in Bolingbrook. That is about a block from the township administration building. It will be energy efficient, accessible by public transportation, centrally located, designed for low maintenance and ADA compliant.

The township has contracted for the purchase of the land for the pantry. We have worked up preliminary architectural plans and submitted them to the Village of Bolingbrook for planning and zoning approval.

"The construction of the new food pantry will be revenue neutral" indicated Township Supervisor Gary Marschke. "That is with the 3 million dollar grant, an ARPA grant, funds in our capital project line item, 2022 budget surplus and sale of existing food pantry building, there will be no tax increase for the new food pantry".

Food insecurity is not a temporary issue. DuPage Township's food pantry has been serving our residents for over 20 years. Northern Illinois Food Bank is celebrating it's 40th year.

We are extremely grateful that Congressman Foster recognized the need and gave us this tremendous help. Without it, we would not have been able to get this project on the road.

On Thursday February 23, Congressman Bill Foster visited our township and at a Senior event presented the Township with the check for Three Million Dollars. We have pictures commemorating the presentation to the right and on page two.



DuPage Township welcomed Congressman Bill Foster February 23rd at the Senior Hoedown, where he presented Supervisor Gary Marschke a check for \$3,000,000 for the construction of the new DuPage Township Resource Center and Food Pantry. The funds are a grant as part of the larger federal infrastructure investment.

Bolingbrook Mayor Mary Alexander-Basta said that these plans demonstrate what could be accomplished when government bodies work together. Marschke thanked Congressman Foster, Mayor Alexander-Basta, County Executive Jennifer Bertino-Tarrant and acknowledged Administrator Jackie Traynere and Grant Writer Karolina Strack for their work in securing the grant.

Also in attendance were County Board Member Raquel Mitchell, DuPage Township Clerk Barbara Parker, Assessor Ken Harris, Collector Monty Jackson. and Trustees Tom Braxton, Terri Ransom, and Reem Townsend.

Congressman Foster's remarks acknowledged the need for services provided by the township, foremost among those is the food pantry that serves hundreds of families every month. The current food pantry is in the former township highway garage in Romeoville, a cramped space with limited access, making it difficult to provide support for families in need.

Plans call for the new Resource Center to be constructed at a centrally located site in Bolingbrook. The Resource Center will house the food pantry and have additional space for other outreach services offered by the township. The location will be designed for traffic access, parking, and full compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).



"Our goals have been focused on two areas," Marschke told the guests at the Senior Hoedown. "Improving and expanding the Senior programs and opening a better, more accessible food pantry." He explained that those services are in addition to the township's longstanding General Assistance and Emergency Assistance programs, passport application service, home energy assistance, and serving as a satellite office of the Will County Clerk and Recorder of Deeds.

The Hoedown was attended by over 250 Seniors who enjoyed a buffet lunch of barbequed and fried chicken, potatoes, vegetables, and dessert, and an afternoon of music and dancing with a Western style.

GENERAL AND EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

GENERAL ASSISTANCE

General Assistance is a state mandated program for those individuals who have absolutely no income and little assets. General Assistance is an ongoing 12 month program and is considered a program of "last resort." Recipients receive a benefit to help with basic necessities, utilities and housing. Contact the General Assistance office to see if you qualify.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

Emergency Assistance is a program to help residents in "life threatening" circumstances such as rental eviction or utility shut-off. Also, residents can receive work related assistance with regards to car repair. Assistance is only given once in a 12 month period. Applicants must meet financial and nonfinancial qualifications.



ASISTENCIA GENERAL

Asistencia General is un programa mandado por el estado de Illinois por aquellas pesonsas con absolutamente ningún ingresso. Asistencia General es un programa por un máximo de 12 meses y es considerado un programa de "ultimo recurso." Residentes recibe un beneficio para ayudar con necesidades básicas, utilidades y renta. Llame a la oficina de Asistencia General para mas informatción.

ASISTENCIA DE EMERGENCIA

Asistencia de Emergencia es un programa por personas en circunstancias de "peligro de vida" como evicción o perdido de servicios publicos. Además, residentes pueden recibir asistencia relacionada con el trabajo como arreglamiento del automovil. Asistencia es disponible una vez, cada 12 meses. Residentes tienen que calificar financialmente y no financiero.
