#### **FOOD PANTRY UPDATE**

The Food Pantry project is proceeding. We have submitted drawings and plans to the Bolingbrook Zoning and Planning Commission. A public hearing was scheduled for June but is now rescheduled for August 16th at 7 PM in the Village Board Room. Additional information was needed such as a traffic study and security plan before the hearing. To recap, the location is the corner of Canterbury Ln and Lily Cache. This is less than a block away from the Township complex and Levy Center.

In the meantime, we have received additional financial aid for the project.

Thru the efforts of Jackie Traynere, our Will County Board Member and Jennifer Bertino Tarrant our Will County Executive, we received a \$500,000 grant for storm water runoff at the pantry. This will enable us to put in underground tanks to accommodate runoff.

Also, our State Senator, Rachel Ventura has been working to help the township food

pantry. She has arranged for a state grant of \$500,000 to help with the paving of the food pantry parking lot.

These are in addition to the 3 million dollar federal grant arranged by Congressman Bill Foster.

We greatly appreciate the help our elected officials have provided to make this project a reality. As we mentioned before, the project will be "revenue neutral". The township levy will not be increased to pay for the construction of the food pantry.

We are in the process of hiring a firm to be the "Construction Manager" for the project. They will be putting out the actual bid packages for the various trades working on the construction.

We are hoping to have the bids go out this fall with actual construction to commence in March or April 2024 weather permitting.

In the meantime, I'd like to thank the Northern Illinois Food Bank for a\$101,000 grant to the Food Pantry. This will be used to purchase a new truck for food pickups at local supermarkets and deliveries to senior apartment complexes.

# Honoring MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day was honored on May 29 at DuPage Township's historic cemeteries.

The Boardman Cemetery on Paxson Drive in Bolingbrook dates to 1831, when Captain Harry Boardman set out an acre of his farm as a community burial ground. Among those interred at Boardman are veterans and residents dating back to the American Civil War.

Similarly, Alexander Cemetery, adjacent to Murphy Park in Romeoville, was established in 1845 when James Alexander buried his daughter at the site. It too hosts the final resting place of historic war veterans and their families.

The Clerk oversees the annual meeting until a moderator is voted in, administers the oath of office then takes the minutes of the meeting. The Clerk is required to attest to any payout of funds that the township supervisor issues from the township treasure. The Clerk is also a notary and can register residents to vote. In my absence, we have a very capable staff who can also assist with these tasks and many other items. Our staff is second to none. Our fabulous staff is ready and willing to assist you.



## Discovering Township History



Recently, the township has found a number of historical documents pertaining to the township. Some of the documents date back all the way to the 1860's! The township, in collaboration and partnership with Fountaindale Library and the Bolingbrook Historical Preservation Commission, is attempting to preserve, document and display a number of artifacts pertaining to the early days of the township, which include areas of Bolingbrook and Romeoville. Some of the documents include election rolls, voter affidavits, bounty claims (for wildlife) and supervisor vouchers among other things.

At the township's April 16th board meeting, the board approved a Deed of Gift to donate to the Bolingbrook Historical Preservation Commission to catalog, preserve and digitize these documents. The Fountaindale Library will work to upload all the documents online for the public to see. The library already has a number of township documents online from a previous donation. # The falling leaves drift by the window The autumn leaves of red and gold

When he sang "Autumn Leaves," Nat King Cole brought those words to life, reminding us how summer dissolves into fall as part of nature's seasonal cycle. We look at the coming months as the end of a season. School begins again in late August, baseball season winds down, and by September the weather gradually grows cooler. We realize that fall is beginning as summer draws to a close.

As we enter the third quarter of our year, it's important to remember that the earth has its own clock. It takes one trip around the sun to complete a year, and because the earth is tilted as it moves, we get more sunlight or less sunlight depending on what point we're on in our orbit. That's why days are longer in the summer and shorter in the winter.

Fall begins on the autumnal equinox, the date on which the length of day's light and night's darkness are equal. This year it happens on September 23. Two Latin words aequus (equal) and nox (night) are combined to form "equinox," indicating the equal length of day and night.

DuPage Township follows the seasons. The wax and wane of the hours in the day drive the schedule of events. Whether it's the exercise programs for Seniors, youth programs, bingo nights, scheduled tours, or any of the myriad of options offered through the township and the Sarah and Joseph Levy Senior Center, the daytime hours and the nighttime hours are filled with opportunities for education, entertainment, and fellowship.
