THE LEVY SENIOR CENTER

The Levy Senior Center has been a part of DuPage Township for over 30 years. In 1991, the Joseph and Saah Levy Foundation approached the village of Bolingbrook about establishing a senior center in Bolingbrook. The village referred them to DuPage Township and its Supervisor, John Annerino.

Under John's leadership, the Levy Center was born. The Levy Foundation contributed \$300,000 to the land and the Village of Bolingbrook; at the time, it was valued at \$200,000.

The Township put in \$500,000, making the total contributions \$1,000,000.

The Levy Senior Center opened in 1992. The Levy Center, located at 251 Canterbury Lane, next to the township administration building, is open to all seniors 55 years and older. It is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday for the exclusive use of seniors. The Levy is available for rental by the public in the evenings and weekends. That includes weddings, quinceaneras, birthday parties, anniversaries, etc. All the proceeds from rentals go into seniors' programming and the overhead of the Levy Center.

Services at the Levy Center fall into two general categories. The first is Education. Under education, we provide seminars on many topics geared toward seniors. Our "Lunch and

Learn" program is especially popular; we even provide a light lunch with the seminar.

We provide tax filing assistance, legal seminars on trusts and wills, health seminars geared towards seniors, Medicare information, vaccine clinics, and safety seminars. Our seniors are constantly coming up with topics they want more information about.

The second category is recreation. Our programs range from exercise classes, line dancing, lunch trips, plays, day trips, ball games, art classes, card games, chorus, casino trips, week-long bus trips, pottery classes, Senior Olympics, etc. Most events are free or have a minimal cost.

To participate in these programs, you must register at the Levy Center, and registration is free. You will then be on our list to receive a monthly bulletin listing the events for the coming month. You will also receive flash emails on special events and details on events listed in the monthly bulletin.

We currently have over 2600 seniors registered at the Levy Center. If you are 55 years of age or over, please join us.

Residents may come to the pantry twice a month and receive a supplement for planning meals for their families.

LIHEAP Program Changes for 2023-2024!



- LIHEAP will start October 2nd and run through August 15th, 2024.
- Priority application periods will return with seniors over 65, those with a disability and those with a child 5 and under in the household applying in October.
- Those with a disconnection notice or have been disconnected can apply in November.
- All income eligible households can apply starting in **December**.

HOW DOES LIHEAP WORK?

So what is LIHEAP? (Pronounced as "lie-heap")

LIHEAP stands for Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program and it is a federally funded program that started in 1980 to help low income families with their heating utilities during the winter months when heating costs are higher. LIHEAP is administered by local Community Action Agencies, in Will County. The action agency is the Will County Center for Community Concerns.

How does LIHEAP work?

Depending on your income and household size, a family is given a benefit amount that is then put on your utility account. If you pay both Nicor and ComEd, you will have two benefit amounts, the larger benefit going to your primary heating utility, Nicor for heating gas or ComEd for electrical heat. The benefit will cover the balance on the utility and the remainder will be a credit on your account. The credit will then allow a household to go a number of months without a utility payment. However, if the balance is more than the benefit amount. then the benefit will all be applied and lower the balance.

Seasons of Renewal

Welcome to autumn – that time of year trees put themselves to sleep, lawnmowers are put away, and leaf rakes are put to use.

It's cooler in autumn. The air takes on a different quality. Though the trees, plants, and forest animals go into hibernation, it's also a time of renewal, of letting go. In F. Scott Fitzgerald's classic novel "The Great Gatsby," autumn is seen as the time to start something new: "Life starts all over again when it gets crisp in the fall." Even the trees let go of their leaves, knowing that they're useless when winter comes.

We think of spring as the time of renewal. Plants and animals come back, and the frost recedes from the grass. But the letting-go of autumn has to happen before spring, so autumn really is part of the process of renewal.

We operate the same way. Autumn fades into winter and into the calendar's new year when we resolve to let go of old habits and set out on new paths. Just like the trees, our renewals are a process of letting go and starting fresh.

DuPage Township is a place where we can let go of old habits and chart a path toward new ones. The Senior programs at the Joseph and Sara Levy Center are rich with ways to let go of solitary habits and broaden life in new ways. The expanding youth program at the township offers a range of activities for children and cooperative events shared with local groups. Volunteer opportunities are plentiful, from helping at the DuPage Township Food Pantry to serving on event organizing committees.

As always, DuPage Township is available to you as a means to renew. Meet new friends, help your neighbors, learn something new, and have some laughs.

Fitzgerald wrote that when it's crisp in the fall, life starts all over again. The leaves become crisp, too, and when they do, the poet Emily Bronte could hear them: "Every leaf speaks bliss to me, fluttering from the autumn tree."
