SECTION 3: SERVICES. DuPage Township shall offer General Assistance services to Wheatland Township residents limited to the application process for all programs. This service shall be available to Wheatland Township residents by appointment only. Wheatland Township

shall be responsible for contacting the DuPage Township General Assistance Director and arranging for appointments for its residents.

SECTION 4: PAYMENT FOR SERVICES. Wheatland Township agrees to pay the DuPage Township fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each application submitted by a Wheatland Township resident and processed by DuPage Township. If a Wheatland Township resident qualifies for general assistance or emergency assistance, Wheatland Township shall be responsible for the payment of any such funds.

SECTION 5: INDEMNIFICATION. DuPage Township, its employees and contractors shall indemnify and hold harmless the Wheatland Township and any of its officers, officials, employees, or agents from any and all claims, demands, liability, loss, damages, fines penalties, attorney's fees and litigation expenses (collectively "Loss") arising out of injury to, including the death of, persons and/or damage to property, to the extent caused by the negligent acts or omissions of DuPage Township or any of its officers, officials, employees, contractors or agents related to services performed under this Intergovernmental Agreement. #### RECITALS

WHEREAS, DuPage Township, Illinois, ("DuPage Township"), is a unit of local government established under the Illinois Township Code, 60 ILCS 1/1-1, et. seq; and,

WHEREAS, Wheatland Township ("Wheatland Township") is a unit of local government established under the Illinois Township Code, 60 ILCS 1/1-1, et. seq; and,

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois provides that units of local government may contract among themselves, to obtain or share services and to exercise, combine or transfer any power or function, in any manner not prohibited by law or by ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1, et. seq. provides additional powers to units of local government that work together; and

WHEREAS, DuPage Township offers a food pantry for use by its residents; and WHEREAS, Wheatland Township residents are in need of food pantry services; and

WHEREAS, DuPage Township and Wheatland Township have determined that it is in the best interests of each of them, respectively, to enter into the terms of this Intergovernmental Agreement, and that their residents and constituents will receive benefits from this Intergovernmental Agreement;

Wheatland Township, its employees and contractors shall indemnify and hold harmless DuPage Township and any of its officers, officials, employees, or agents from any and all claims, demands, liability, loss, damages, fines penalties, attorney's fees and litigation expenses (collectively "Loss") arising out of injury to, including the death of, persons and/or damage to property, to the extent caused by the negligent acts or omissions of Wheatland 01· any of its officers, officials, employees, contractors or agents related to the terms of this Intergovernmental Agreement. Both parties shall name each other as an additional insured on their insurance policies and provide each other with copies of their certificates of insurance policies so stating.

Good morning. A rundown on the change orders from yesterday:


- 1. Undercuts Self-explanatory and discussed previously. Direct subcontractor cost.
- PH 2 Parking Lot Remove and Replace Includes excavation and paving of the small lot in Phase 2. The cost is half a day of paving crew, half a day of excavation crew, plus stone base course furnish and install.
- 3. Walk and Curb Per email dated 4 August. The cost is for getting an excavation crew there we just charged for material for the concrete.
- 4. Phasing Post bid, the discussion was had about how to run the job and keep the senior center lot open. It was agreed upon to phase starting with the new lot to the East and go from there. This resulted in the following:
